CIRCULAR

Subject: Existing and Revised Academic Regulations for the ongoing students-regarding

Ref: Vice Chancellor's approval dated 11-8-2020

In continuation to the resolution in the Deans and Heads meeting held on 6-8-2020 on declaring the results of ongoing students for (Jan- June-20) semester, the existing and revised Academic Regulations to be followed are as below.

EXISTING ACADEMIC REGULATIONS

The performance of each student enrolled in a course will be assessed at the end of each semester. Evaluation of all P.G., M.Phil, M.Tech and Integrated PG courses is done under the Grading System. There will be 7 letter grades; A+, A, B+, B, C, D and F on a 10-point scale which carries 10,9,8,7,6,5,0 grade points respectively

The final result in each course will be determined based on continuous assessment and performance in the end semester examination which will be in the ratio of 40:60 in case of theory courses and 60:40 in laboratory courses (practicals).

Students must obtain a minimum of 40% marks (Grade 'D') in each course in order to pass in the Post-Graduate and Integrated PG courses examination provided that the student, who obtains less than 40% marks in any course taken by him/her, may be permitted to take the supplementary examination in the course/s concerned within four weeks after the commencement of the next semester. Appearance at such examinations shall be allowed only once. Those students who get less than 40% in the supplementary examination shall have to repeat the course concerned or take an equivalent available course with the approval of Head of the Department/Centre and the Dean of the School concerned.

In the case of M.Phil. and M. Tech. courses, a student must obtain a minimum of 50% marks in each course in order to pass in that course provided that the student who obtains less than 50% marks in any course taken by him/her, may be permitted to take a supplementary examination in the course/s concerned within four weeks after the commencement of the next semester. Appearance at such examinations shall be allowed only once. Those students who secure less than 50% in the supplementary examination shall have to repeat that course or taken an equivalent available course with the approval of the Head of the Department/Centre and the Dean of the School concerned.

REVISED ACADEMIC REGULATIONS FOR THE CURRENT SEMESTER ((JANUARY-JUNE 2020)

For outgoing students (Final Semester):

1. The final result in each course shall be determined based on continuous assessment and performance till the previous semester's examination (Minimum CGPA 5.00), which shall be in the ratio of 50:50 in case of theory courses.
2. There shall not be any end semester examination. In lieu of end semester examination, 50 marks shall be computed based on the past performance in the program (CGPA) till previous semester.
3. For the practical/laboratory courses, the final marks shall be determined based on continuous assessment of the laboratory records and will be scaled to 100 marks. There shall not be any exams for the practical/laboratory courses.
4. In case a student has not written/appeared for any continuous assessment before the lockdown, or an online assessment during the lockdown period, then he/she has to appear for one after their return to the university.
5. The continuous assessment is divided into two parts of 25 marks each. The best of the continuous assessment(s) shall be considered for the first 25 marks after scaling it. For the remaining 25 marks, it shall be maximum of the performance of the student in the continuous assessment (scaled to 25 marks) or 75% of 25 (i.e.18.75) marks.
6. The overall marks obtained in continuous assessment and CGPA of past performance as explained above shall be added to arrive at an equivalent grade for each subject.
7. In case a student is not satisfied with the grade, he/she can appear for the special examination, on reopening as per the date decided by the Academic unit (as per the revised Academic Calendar). There shall be no further supplementary or improvement examination for the outgoing students.
8. In case of dissertations/project reports, the student shall be assessed based on dissertation/report submitted. Internal committee(s) of the School shall assess the dissertation/project and award the marks/grades.

Note: 1. All such outgoing students who could not write even one continuous assessment in this semester may submit their request/option to the Controller of Examinations through the Dean/Head latest by 26-6-2020 through email for awarding them "zero" marks in continuous assessment out of 25 marks and declare the result according to above mentioned procedure or they wish to write the special exam once the University reopens. The option once exercised cannot be changed.

2. All such outgoing students who have a maximum of two backlogs and are eligible otherwise may submit their request/option to the Controller of Examinations through the Dean/Head latest by 26-6-2020 through email for availing the option of *special supplementary examinations (though exams will not be conducted)*. In these cases the continuous assessment already evaluated out of 40 marks shall be scaled to 25 marks. For the remaining 25 marks, it shall be proportionate to the performance of the student in the continuous assessment or 75% of 25 marks whichever is higher. In lieu of special supplementary examination, 50 marks shall be computed based on the past performance in the program (CGPA) till previous semester.

3. The attendance requirement of 75% stands waived for this semester as a special case in view of the lockdown due to Pandemic.

For ongoing students (Intermediate semester):

1. The final result in each course shall be determined based on continuous assessment and performance till the previous semester's examination (Minimum CGPA 5.00), which shall be in the ratio of 50:50 in case of theory courses.
2. There shall not be any end semester examination. In lieu of end semester examination, 50 marks shall be computed based on the past performance in the program (CGPA) till previous semester.
3. For the practical/laboratory courses, the final marks shall be determined based on continuous assessment of the laboratory records and will be scaled to 100 marks. There shall not be any exams for the practical/laboratory courses.
4. The continuous assessment is divided into two parts of 25 marks each. The best of the continuous assessment(s) shall be considered for the first 25 marks after scaling it. For the remaining 25 marks, it shall be maximum of the performance of the student in the continuous assessment (scaled to 25 marks) or 75% of 25 (i.e.18.75) marks.
5. Students who could not write even one continuous assessment test in this semester in any course/ courses, they may submit their request/option to the Controller of Examinations through the Dean/Head latest by 20-8-2020 through email for awarding them "zero" marks in continuous assessment for that course (s) out of 25 marks and declare the result according to above mentioned procedure or they wish to write the continuous assessment test (s) once the University reopens. The option once exercised cannot be changed.
6. The overall marks obtained in continuous assessment and CGPA of past performance as explained above shall be added to arrive at an equivalent grade for each subject.
7. In case a student is not satisfied with the grade, he/she can appear for the special examination, on reopening of the University. There shall be no further supplementary or improvement examination for the on-going students in this semester.
8. In case of dissertations/project reports, the student shall be assessed based on dissertation/report submitted. Internal committee(s) of the School shall assess the dissertation/project and award the marks/grades.
9. For the course work of M.Phil. and Ph.D. during this semester, the result in each course shall be determined based on the continuous assessment for 50 marks. The continuous assessment is divided into two parts of 25 marks each. The best of the continuous assessment(s) shall be considered for the first 25 marks after scaling it. For the remaining 25 marks, it shall be maximum of the performance of the student in the continuous assessment (scaled to 25 marks) or 75% of 25 (i.e.18.75) marks whichever is higher. For the remaining 50 marks, it shall be 75% of 50 (i.e.37.50) marks as the Ph. D students are declared as Pass or Fail in their course work and CGPA is not shown.
9. The attendance requirement of 75% stands waived for this semester as a special case in view of the lockdown due to Pandemic.

In continuation to the resolution in the Deans and Heads meeting held on 10-4-2020 followed by recommendations of the two committees chaired by PVC's and the meeting held on 11-5-20, on declaring the results of ongoing students for (Jan- June-20) semester, the existing and revised Academic Regulations to be followed are as below.

EXISTING ACADEMIC REGULATIONS

The performance of each student enrolled in a course will be assessed at the end of each semester. Evaluation of all P.G., M.Phil, M.Tech and Integrated PG courses is done under the Grading System. There will be 7 letter grades; A+, A, B+, B, C, D and F on a 10-point scale which carries 10,9,8,7,6,5,0 grade points respectively

The final result in each course will be determined based on continuous assessment and performance in the end semester examination which will be in the ratio of 40:60 in case of theory courses and 60:40 in laboratory courses (practicals).
